◆ What is the FAA Aircraft Dispatcher Certificate?

The FAA Aircraft Dispatcher Certificate is a professional credential issued under **14 CFR Part 65**. It qualifies you to legally dispatch flights for U.S. airlines, making operational decisions alongside the captain. Dispatchers are responsible for flight planning, weather analysis, fuel calculations, and regulatory compliance.

◆ What does the Flight Dispatch Network offer for certification?

- Be at least **23 years old** to take the practical exam (you can start earlier)

- Have a high school diploma or equivalent
- Pass the **ADX written exam** before taking the oral/practical

No prior aviation experience is required—FDN welcomes career changers and first-time aviation students.
